The chaplains believe that the jamboree offers profound proof of the diversity in Scouting and each is prepared to serve many denominations and faiths. Indicative of this approach, their nameplates

do not designate their religion or denomination. A reason for this ecumenical approach is that if you need counseling or if you're homesick, it doesn't matter what religion you are or whether you're a Scout or Scout leader.

The jamboree provides reinforcement that there is no "Scouting Theology." Scouting has no specific reference to any particular religion, just the credo, "A Scout is Reverent."

The chaplain's role is to bless the Scouts, act as problem solvers, solution seekers, and provide counseling to all jamboree participants.

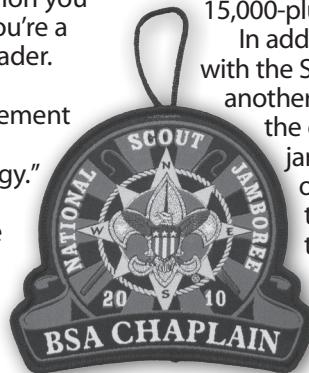
The interaction of the chaplains with each other is a source of personal

Everyone invited to participate in Friday's 5K fun run

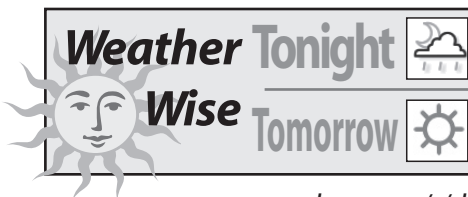
Be at your region headquarters by 5:45 a.m. Friday for the 5K fun run. All races will start simultaneously at 6 a.m. and follow a three-mile loop through each region. Floodlights will illuminate the starting points.

There will be mile markers with water stations throughout each course, but runners are urged to bring their own water and hydrate before the start. Each course will also have 30 marshals throughout the course so that participants will never be out of sight. Marshals are asked to assemble at the starting points by 5:15 a.m. Runners'

bibs were distributed to Scoutmasters for participants, but bibs are not required to participate. If you didn't get a bib, please come out anyway. Water and runner bibs were supplied by Good Turn for America.

You can walk, run, or a combination. Just join the fun Friday. Participation will fulfill the requirement for the 5K jamboree patch segment. Completion of the requirement will be on your honor.

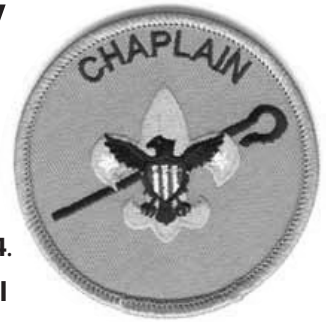

Foot hygiene

Guidelines to avoid foot problems:

- Wash feet with soap and water at least once a day, with extra attention between the toes and under nails.
- Feet should be thoroughly dried and aired before putting on clean socks.
- If your feet perspire a great deal, use foot powder at least twice a day.
- Shoes should not be so large that the foot moves inside the shoe.
- There should not be any pressure points or binding spots.
- Clean socks should be worn daily.
- Wear large enough socks to allow the toes to remain straight, but tight enough to minimize wrinkling.
- Socks with holes may cause blisters and should be discarded.
